By investigating brain plasticity in varying social contexts, it seeks to overcome the nature-nurture dichotomy. Here, after a brief overview of the field, I will illustrate its potential by reviewing recent evidence on cultural variation in brain mechanisms underlying person perception and emotion regulation.
